
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A Message From Our Superintendent!

Emily Grasch from the Muskegon Conservation District brought in several bee trays with thousands of live working worker bees to share with our class. Don't worry, the bees were sealed in the portable hive which gave us a unique opportunity to view the bees at work (and have some of their honey). Honey Bees, along with the many other bee species, are beneficial for many reasons. Not only do they play a critical ecosystem role but they are a key player in the production of our global food supply. By better understanding the bees, their needs, and their current struggle with the colony collapse disorder, we can work to design policy and land management solutions to ensure their survival. The American Library Association has named October as TeenTober month. Middle and High School students at North Muskegon Schools were challenged to write a haiku poem (the traditional haiku format is a 3 line poem with 17 syllables written as a 5-7-5 syllable count). Students could write a poem about the traditional haiku topic of nature, or about one of the TeenTober topics featured in our library book displays this month (Star Wars Reads, Horror/Halloween, LGBTQ History Month, Bully Prevention Month, Hispanic Heritage Month, or World Space Week). We had some wonderful haiku poems submitted by our talented North Muskegon writers! See if you can tell which topic they chose to write about. North Muskegon Middle School/High School Library Media Center Gets a 21st Century Update

This fall the Middle School/High School Library Media Center got a facelift to include technology updates and encourage collaboration between students. The result has been amazing and students are very happy with the improvements! The updates brought in new options for technology integration, including portable charging towers, tables with built in power, and a collaboration station which allows groups of students to plug their Chromebooks into a central location and share their screens to a large monitor for the whole group to see.

The new seating options allow for more choices for individuals, as well as small and large groups, and the amount of seating has nearly doubled. Students can choose more traditional seating options, or choose from fun, flexible arrangements. There are also tables with whiteboard tops and moveable glass boards for working on those tricky calculus or chemistry problems. The final result is a space that is more inviting, promotes technology use, and is more usable for our students.


Austin Vanderweele, son of Bill and Lori

North Muskegon is one of only a few schools in West Michigan to offer this level of safety equipment for our players.


