PROGRESS THROUGH THE PANDEMIC

Construction continues all around Mona Shores Schools. An intentional focus on the elementary buildings has been our mantra from day one. When construction is complete all 4 elementary buildings will be like brand new, inside and out. Plumbing, electrical, carpet, paint, lockers, furniture, classroom technology,

At this time all four elementary buildings are under construction. Our students, staff, and families have been incredible with their flexibility as construction often changes entrances, drives, and hallways. We look forward to the completion of each of these projects. The timeline is below:


Campbell: Currently under construction with scheduled completion in December 2022.
Churchill: Currently under construction with scheduled completion in April 2022.
Lincoln Park: Currently under construction with scheduled completion in September 2021.
Ross Park: Currently under construction with scheduled completion in September 2023.

The middle school construction is set to begin about one year from now. The work there is scheduled to include new locker commons at the end of each wing, all classrooms will be refreshed with carpet, paint, classroom technology, and furniture. Windows, doors, restrooms, plumbing, electrical, and HVAC are planned as well.

As you can see, progress, planning, and future thinking have continued in our schools. We look forward to being able to welcome our school community into these updated and overhauled facilities when they are complete. BONDED CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Construction at all elementary buildings is well underway. Lincoln Park Elementary is about 70% complete and will be fully completed by September 2021. Churchill Elementary is about 60% complete and is scheduled to be completed by April 2022. Campbell Elementary started this December and is 10% complete with a scheduled completion date of December 2022. Finally, Ross Park elementary started construction this spring break and has a completion date of September 2023. Total construction cost for all four buildings is approximately \$56,495,000 not including contingency and fees. Currently, of the \$46,179,375 received for the bonds we sold in February 2019, we have approximately \$9,300,000 remaining.


On April 1, 2021 we closed on our second series of bonds for a total amount of \$47,044,904 to fund the remaining balance of construction. These bonds sold at a premium with a par value of \$38,170,000 and a coupon rate which varied between 4% and 5%. The effective interest rate the District will have to pay on this series is 2.79% over the life of the bonds which will be fully redeemed in 2048. We had excellent participation in the bond sale with over \$168,000,000 worth of orders for the bonds, equating to more than a 400% subscription rate. This demand reflects the quality of the issue and the desire and trust the market has in investing in Mona Shores!

When we asked our community to approve the bond in 2018, we presented a 30-year plan where we could address the needs of the District without having to increase the millage rate over that period. Part of that plan is to renew the 2015 Bond when it matures in 2030. I'm happy to report that based on how the two bond sales for the 2018 Bond were structured, in regards to interest rates and maturity payoff schedules, when we ask the community in 2030 to renew the 2015 Bond we will be able to generate approximately \$60 million without having to increase the debt levy. This will allow us to complete whatever is still needed at the Middle School and do some great things at the High School. Overall, the District is set up well to address its infrastructure needs for the foreseeable future. What an exciting time to be a Sailor!



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District Updates



Mona Shores 2021 STATE ASSESSMENT SCHEDULE

Beginning after Spring Break (April-June), schools in Michigan traditionally begin giving the annual State assessments in 3rd grade through 11th grade. The COVID-19 Global Pandemic cancelled these assessments in 2020, but The Federal and State government have been debating about what the correct approach may be for this year. 3rd grade through 8th grade will give the M-STEP, which is the Michigan Student Test of Educational Progress. 8th graders will also be taking the PSAT for ELA and Math. 9th and 10th grade students will take the PSAT and 11th grade students will take the Michigan Merit Exam (MME), which includes SAT/ACT WorkKeys and the M-STEP. Much of these required assessments are administered online. The MDE has granted an extended testing window and there may be further flexibility and guidance soon. In the meantime, Mona Shores will be fully prepared for the M-STEP, SAT, and all other State Assessments from a student, staff, and technology perspective.

- The M-STEP will assess students in 3rd-7th grades in English language arts (reading, writing, and listening) and mathematics. Science and Social Studies will be assessed in 5th and 8th grades.
- Grades 8, 9, and 10 will be assessed using the PSAT which assesses reading, writing, math, and critical thinking.
- Grade 11 will be assessed in Science and Social Studies in addition to the SAT.

The table to the right will help lay out our assessment plan for the 2021 testing season.

Covid-19 Vaccine Clinics Bring Sense of Hope and Security to Muskegon County School Employees

Keeping mentally, physically, and emotionally healthy during "normal" life is challenging enough, but add in a pandemic and....well, you all know what that does. Let's face it, we have all been living it for over a year now.

However, from the time the Covid-19 vaccine became available back in December of 2020, local school superintendents have been working closely with officials at Public Health Muskegon County to fast track getting our school employees

vaccinated so that in-person instruction could either continue or in some districts begin for the first time this school year in a safe and healthy manner. This led to the development of local vaccine clinics held at Mona Shores High School from mid January through mid March. Weekly between three and four hundred plus local school employees, including Muskegon Community College staff, were able to receive both doses of the Moderma Vaccine. As our volunteers talked with the individuals receiving the vaccine, it was evident that it brought hope, it lifted spirits, and it gave people a sense of life back. And even though we are not fully "out of the woods," it has brought a feeling of security to so many of our local educators. The vaccine clinics also brought a sense of community back as well. After receiving a dose of the vaccine, it was required of the "patient" to wait a period of fifteen minutes while being observed by a doctor, prior to being released from the building. During that fifteen minutes, it was not uncommon to see the 6 foot spaced chairs in the "waiting area" being turned toward their neighbor and year long catch up conversations taking place. Keep in mind that although these staff members may work for the same school district, they have not been able to collaborate in person for over a year. Seeing each other and being able to spend that fifteen minutes with their colleagues felt like a kid at recess. It was a feeling of pride and freedom even if for such a short period. Truth be told, as their fifteen minutes expired, we actually had to start asking people to leave the waiting area, with a smile of course, as laughter and loud voices shared story after story with their "long lost" comrades.

Putting these clinics together was important and necessary work and took numerous volunteers from both Mona Shores and Public Health Muskegon County. I would most certainly be amiss if I did not publicly thank our Mona Shores office staff for their commitment to this mission every single Saturday for over two months. They showed up week after week with a smile and a servant attitude. In addition, Public Health Muskegon County also provided incredible nurses, a doctor, those staff needed to input data into the state vaccination portal, as well as a Public Health leader. Quite honestly, it felt like a family after being together every Saturday for this period of time. I also want to thank Mona Shores Superintendent, Bill O'Brien as well as Whitehall Superintendent, Jerry McDowell for their vision and leadership at these clinics. I believe it goes without saying, but without these incredible volunteers and their commitment to getting school employees vaccinated, these clinics would not have taken place. We are grateful to each and every one of you.
