North Muskegon Summer Programming Was a Success!

After 18+ months of COVID-related changes impacted students' growth academically, socially and, emotionally, North Muskegon was able to use one-time grant money to fund a large-scale, robust 2021 summer program for students DK through 8th grade!

The summer program was designed to be project-based and focused on appropriate grade-level standards - emphasizing relationship building and fun! Field trips and other place-based activities happened each



week and students had lots of time outside. Additionally, every student received a free breakfast and transportation was provided, including for our students who are school of choice.

To prepare, teachers collaborated to list which standards were most pressing to be revisited during the regular school year. NM teachers then worked to create curriculum maps for the summer programming that was informed by these "high priority" standards.

The summer program occurred over 8 weeks, split into sessions for students to join for as many or few days as they like.

Approximately 250 students attended some part of summer programming DK-8!

Creating a Barrier-Free Trail in the Norse Nature Area


North Muskegon's Environmental Club has been working with our architect, Mr. Harry Wierenga, to develop a barrier-free ADA trail. Our students, staff, and community members have been great supporters of this effort!

Our school has a Norse Nature area on the shore of Bear Lake that is connected to one of our playgrounds. However, the Nature Area has not been accessible to those with disabilities and mobility concerns. The Environmental Club has worked with our MS/HS Librarian,

Mrs. Howard, to improve our research. Additionally, we have contacted the North Muskegon City Manager, Mr. Sam Janson, and the city Public

Works department, local businesses, and contractors for more information and guidance as we planned and began improvements.

The finished path will be stone dust - the same diamond dust used on baseball fields. This will provide a firm, smooth, reliable surface. The paths will need upkeep and will need a layer of gravel to refresh them approximately every three years.

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North Muskegon Restarts "Norse Future Teachers" Program!

Last spring North Muskegon was awarded a "Proud Future Michigan Educators" grant to help kick-start a new and enhanced Norse Future Teacher program. Hosted at our High School, the program involves students first taking the class "Introduction to Teaching" with Mr. Tony Jarvis, which involves practicing self-reflection, mastering a variety of skills teachers will use, visiting college campuses, and attending lectures from guest speakers. After having "Introduction to Teaching" as a prerequisite, our students will become Future Teachers during one of their class periods during the second half of the year - and beyond! As Future Teachers, they will collaborate and be mentored by our own NM teaching staff, work directly with younger NM students, participate in lesson planning, perform direct instruction, and administer assessments. It is our hope that in a few years some of these Future Teachers can return to NM to help form the next generation of educators - and we are off to a great start!

IRACHARITABLE DISTRIBUTIONS

If you wish to donate your RMD to charity, you may be able to take advantage of the Qualified Charitable Distribution provision available to Traditional and Roth IRA owners (or beneficiaries after the death of the owners) who are age 72 or older. If eligible, you can make a Qualified Charitable Distribution of up to \$100,000 in the aggregate per year directly from your IRAs to an eligible organization without incurring any adverse federal income tax consequences. The distribution counts for the purposes of the RMD from IRAs, but is not included in calculating the individual taxpayer's limitation on charitable deductions in the year the donation was made. These tools have made such a difference in my room. We were gifted with 5 Hokki Stools, 5 pairs of headphones, MagnaTiles, Legos, and Hot Wheels cars (see above). The students use these items daily. It's incredible to watch them learn on a Hokki Stool that allows them to make small movements to keep their bodies regulated. The students also use the MagnaTiles, Legos, and Hot Wheels cars daily to help stay calm and take a break. We use the headphones daily with our online reading instruction. Students enjoy being able to listen to their own story distraction free. Being gifted these items from the Norse Education Foundation has made it possible for students to work on their goals in a safe and calming environment. Thank you again for supporting our learners.


