

Life at School: I feel safe at school.




Student Life Survey (Grades 9-12) - 886 Responses

Bonded Construction Update

Churchill is finished! All classrooms are complete and the students and staff have settled into their new spaces. Due to the pandemic and shut down in May 2020, the entire construction schedule had to be re-phased delaying completion to just after spring break of 2022 rather than the start of school. Original construction cost was \$11,640,078. We had budgeted an additional \$847,749 in construction contingencies of which we have \$211,579 remaining to date, for a total build cost of \$12,276,248. We fully expect to have some minor items pop up and need correcting throughout the spring, including a water main replacement in June, which could reduce that contingency amount should that occur.

Construction is continuing to go well. Ross Park Elementary and Campbell Elementary are on schedule and the Middle School construction started at spring break. Once again, I would like to thank our community and staff for their support and patience throughout this project.









Life & Learning: The Impacts of COVID-19

a wessage from Andy Hogston, Director of Curriculum, Instruction & Assessment

It is with a hopeful heart that I write this article. This is yet another opportunity to reflect and ponder the arduous journey of a Global Pandemic. Personally, professionally, and collectively we have endured two years of upheaval and disruption. As a school-community we have experienced loss and sacrificed for the betterment of others. We have complied with ever changing mandates and guidelines. As parents, grandparents, teachers, and district leaders we have made difficult decisions when all potential options seemed impossible. We persevered and did the best that we could. There are moments and memories that will leave an indelible mark. Ultimately, I have gained an appreciation and admiration for the everyday "heroes" that walk amongst us. We can learn a great deal from them about academic pursuits and content, but more importantly about life.

We seem to hear incessantly about the "learning loss" that this generation of students has experienced, but very seldom do we hear about the learning and perspective that has been gained. To generally dismiss the complicated work and efforts of our teachers, students, and parents is mistaken. On the other hand, we should not discount the impacts and trauma caused by the pandemic. Every generation is confronted with challenges. School, work, and life provides no shortage of stress and difficulty, but despite the COVID-19 Pandemic, great things continue to happen at Mona Shores!

Considerations & Perspective:

- We devised plans and constantly revised them. We found ways to mitigate risk and manage mandates at buildings and in classrooms. We stayed open, offered options, and the learning continued. We found ways to provide co-curricular activities.
- Approximate In-person Days:
 - o 19-20 School Year: 122 (Lockdown 58 days Virtual)
 - o 20-21 School Year: 170 (mandated virtual 10 days)
 - Adjusted daily schedules at all levels (Hybrid at HS)
 - 948 fully virtual students to begin the school year & 2771 in-person
 - o 21-22 School Year: Hopefully 180 (Less than 30 students K-8 virtual)
- We offered in-person learning for all days except those that we were mandated to close.
- We have provided over 2,250,000 meals to the Mona Shores School Community.
- We distributed and provided over 3800 Chromebooks to families during the lockdown.

Interesting Data Points

- There are many measures and milestones for determining growth and achievement.
- According to our Star Reading & Star Math Benchmark assessments K-8 students are overall maintaining skills, growing skills, and making gains.
- MSHS students taking AP classes increased from 249 in 2019 to 302 in 2021
- Historical SAT Performance 2018: 1007, 2019: 984, 2020:1065, 2021: 1002


Technology Update by Chad Pranger, Director of Technology

The way our kids and community have adapted over the past two years has been simply incredible. As we look back on the 2021-2022 school year, I think it's important to highlight the Mona Shores commitment to keeping kids in classrooms.

With the onset of the pandemic a completely new virtual program was launched. I can speak to the device distribution side of the effort and that was only a part of it. After the Stay at Home Order was issued and speaking with Mr. O'Brien, it became apparent that this would happen in a matter of days, not weeks. Everyone from The Operations Crew, The Grounds Crew, Front Office staff, Principals, Administrators, Technology Staff and many other volunteers joined us to distribute devices for students. Over 100 device carts were disassembled in a

matter of days to ensure each student was equipped with a device for virtual use. Being part of a great team at Mona Shores made this possible.

The first full time school year, coming out of the 2020-2021 pandemic, has presented a great deal of challenges. Construction has been one of our bigger ones and probably one of the more obvious as you drive past the busy job sites. Our first completed building, Lincoln Park Elementary was available for our community to see on March 16th for the Open House. These newly remodeled buildings speak to Mona Shores Schools and our community's commitment to classroom learning.

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Sailors Make Use of Full Season in First ~ a message from **Uninterrupted Winter Since 2019**

Though it is difficult to conceive, the 2021-22 winter season was the first in three years that was not abbreviated due to the pandemic. The tail end of the 2019-20 winter season was canceled in March and as we all know, last winter was riddled with starts and stops. The indoor season was good to the Sailors this year as multiple teams had banner seasons.

- Girls Basketball won second consecutive OK Green and MHSAA district championships before ending their season in the regional semi-final against Rockford at Byron Center. The girls were also named academic all-state as a team.
- Competitive Cheer won an incredible 13th consecutive Greater Muskegon championship as well as a 4th consecutive conference championship, both in the OK Green as well as the now-defunct OK Black division. Coach Amanda Heethuis was also named district Coach of the Year by the state coaches' association.
- The hockey team won a third consecutive conference championship in Coach Benedict's third year at the helm. The Sailors lost a heartbreaker to Byron Center in the regional final at Lakeshore Sports Center in double overtime.
- While our female bowlers have enjoyed tremendous success recently, the 2021-22 season saw the boys step up to claim the OK Green championship this year. Both teams competed hard at the MHSAA regional hosted by Sherman Bowling Center in Muskegon.
- Though it is not an MHSAA sport, the Mona Shores powerlifters had four state champions at the MHSPLA state championship meet. For the boys, Xander Iversen, Dauson Trigg, and DJ Caviness took home titles. Our lone female champion was Allie Baker.



Teaching and Learning:

Our high school is proud to share that in our pursuit of College, Career and life readiness for all of our students, we have recently assessed our 9th grade, 10th grade and 11th grade students. Since the State of Michigan implemented the mandate for all juniors to take the SAT college entrance exam, we have created the opportunity to test all students on that day. The 9th and 10th grade took PSAT, and the 11th grade took the SAT. The PSAT test is a predictor assessment on how students will fare on the SAT College Readiness Assessment. By having students take these assessments, teachers have a data resource to use in evaluating curriculum, monitor how students are learning, make the necessary adjustments to assist in student achievement and provide students and their parents with college readiness predictors. SCHEDULING 2022-2023

Scheduling for the 2022-2023 school year has wrapped up here at the high school. Students had the opportunity to meet with counselors, update their EDP's and explore Xello (career interest inventory). If your son/daughter did not turn in their scheduling forms, please have them bring them to the counseling office as soon as possible.

MUSKEGON AREA PROMISE

All graduates who reside in and graduate from a Muskegon County School are eligible for TUITION-FREE PROMISE Scholarships. The PROMISE covers tuition (valued at the current Muskegon Community College rate), and mandatory fees (a \$5,400 value). For more information please visit: http://www.muskegonisd.org/career-college/promise/.

Students must:

- Live in the MAISD boundaries
- Graduate with a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or higher
- Apply for FAFSA
- Enroll at Muskegon Community College or Baker College.

NO Application is needed for this award. Students will be sent a letter of eligibility that details instructions to accept the award. Please Note: There is a July 1 deadline.

SCHOLARSHIP FORMS

Any senior who has received a scholarship should fill out the "Award Form" in order to be recognized at the Honors Convocation. This form will be available in early May. Please list all scholarship earnings and awards that you have been granted to date. This includes scholarships/grants that you may or may not accept. Do not include loans or Pell Grants. It is important that you include the full name of the scholarship/award including the college name if applicable.

FINAL TRANSCRIPTS

Seniors will be meeting with their counselors individually for an Exit Interview. During this time seniors must notify their counselor which college (and NCAA if applicable) must receive a final transcript AND place an order for a Final Transcript in Parchment. If your student has trouble doing this, please have them stop in the office.

SCHOLARSHIPS

There are scholarships listed on our Counseling Department website with applications available in our office or online. Please remember that you should allow 5-7 days prior to the deadline for processing. There are monthly listings posted on our high school web page. Please view at the following link: http://www.monashores.net/our-schools/mona-shores-high-school/hsdepartments/counseling/financial-aid--scholarships/.

- Seniors planning to attend Muskegon Community College: Our office has planned a special day for our seniors to visit Muskegon Community College on April 21. Students will go through orientation, take placement tests, and meet with advisors to register for classes. Students must sign up to attend. Please stop in the counseling office for further details.

Students planning to take the May 7 SAT must submit their registration online by April 8. Please visit the CollegeBoard website for more information. https://collegereadiness.collegeboard.org/sat/register/dates-deadlines for more information. Mona Shores High School's code is 232704. The basic fee for the SAT (no writing) is \$55. Please note that there is also an August 27 test date for those wanting to take it before school starts.



DECISION DAY

Decision Day is May 1st. Typically, Decision Day coincides with the date that most seniors are to inform a college of their plan to enroll and make a deposit. This is a state initiative to recognize seniors on their post-secondary plans. We would love for all seniors to add their name to our Sailor college/ career map located outside of the Counseling Office. Please encourage your son/daughter to stop by the Counseling Office to fill out a flag indicating their post secondary plans (college attending, military service, or career) to add to our map.

FINANCIAL AID

Many students/families still have not completed the FAFSA. It is not too late! The financial aid process begins with submitting the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online after October 1. For assistance in completing your FAFSA, please contact either Baker College or attend one of MCC's FAFSA Friday sessions. These services are available to the community (students need not be planning to attend either college for assistance). For more information, please contact the Financial Aid office at MCC: Phone: (231) 773-9131.

SUMMER SCHOOL

Information regarding summer school at Mona Shores High School will be available in the Counseling Office and on our website by the end of April. This is an outstanding opportunity for students to either do credit recovery for one or two classes or do credit enhancement to get ahead in their coursework. Each class spans a three-week time period, and it is imperative that students attend every day during the session. Check out the website for the fees, specific dates, and the courses being offered, or contact your student's counselor.

CREDIT RECOVERY CLASSES

Students who have failed classes or are behind in credits may elect to take an online course after school through the High School's credit recovery program. The student needs to see his/her counselor to complete an application and determine which course needs to be taken. Students may work Monday through Thursday from 3:00 - 4:30 p.m. All work needs to be completed at school and should be finished within a trimester's time. Please contact the counseling office for more information.

TESTING OUT OF CLASSES

Testing out of classes provides students with an opportunity to earn credit in a course by passing an examination. Testing out is only available once per year. Test out dates will take place before the end of the year. Look for more information soon. Students must complete a request form (available in the Athletic/Counseling Office later this month) and then return it along with a refundable \$25 check. Study materials will be available for pickup in the Athletic/ Counseling Office. Students must earn an 80% or better on the exam in order to receive credit for the course.



As we look toward our final weeks and trimester, sending our 8th graders to the High School, and welcoming a new team of rising 6th graders, I am proud of our students and staff at MSMS! They have both continued to show passion for learning, collective responsibility for success, and dedication to serving others. All in the face and fallout of COVID! This has certainly been a phenomenal, strong year for our building.

Since the beginning of the year, Mona Shores Middle School has focused on the three pillars of focus below.




