ALEX YOUNKERS - WORLD LANGUAGE TEACHER AT THE HIGH SCHOOL



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ASBESTOS ANNOUNCEMENT

The regulations of federal law 40 CFR 763.84, as published in the Federal Register, require that local educational agencies annually notify various groups, including building occupants or their legal guardians, regarding asbestos containing materials in the school district buildings and plans related thereto. The above are hereby notified that management plans and inspection reports are available for review at both the Mona Shores Schools Administration building and the office of the Principal in each individual school building.

As specified in the management plans, the district inspects its facilities on a regular basis in compliance with the regulations of the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act. The areas in district buildings containing asbestos have been evaluated and judged to present no health hazard in their current condition as determined by the guidelines of the Environmental Protection Agency and the Department of Public Health.

The district will continue to regularly inspect all areas to assure that the buildings will meet all federal, state and local health and safety standards.

PESTICIDE ADVISORY

Please note that Mona Shores staff must occasionally apply pesticides within and around our school buildings. Except in emergencies, prior notice will be provided by mail before these applications occur to parents who submit a request form. If an emergency application takes place, you will be informed immediately thereafter. 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Transportation Update

TRANSPORTATION REGISTRATION

Opens on July 1st for the 24-25 School Year. You can access the Transportation Link from the Mona Shores website. The walk-out distance for all Mona Shores schools is 1.5 miles. This means that if you live less than 1.5 miles from the assigned school building that your student attends, your student can walk to school or you will need to provide transportation.

YOU MUST BE A RESIDENT TO SUBMIT THIS FORM.

Transportation is only provided to resident students whose permanent residence is 1.5 miles or further from their assigned building. Transportation is NOT provided for elementary students who choose to attend another elementary building in the district other than the building assigned to their residence.

Please complete a separate form for each student on the transportation website.

Bus routes and bus stop locations are reviewed each year and may be changed for efficiency. Bus stop locations are established in accordance with state and federal laws and school board policies. Bus drivers and aides are NOT allowed to make changes to bus stops or routes. Parents of students with specialized transportation needs will be contacted directly by the Transportation Department staff.

Bus routes will be emailed to families the week before school starts. Bus rules and expectations are posted on the website. If you have questions, please feel free to contact the Transportation Department at 231-332-8269.

A "Brief" Summary of Sailor Athletics in 2023-2024

Sailor Athletics has prided itself on the success of our programs in and out of the classroom. This school year was no different. We did not win any state titles, but we saw plenty of success with the close of the OK Green Conference and also within the State Tournament. Next school year we will be in a new conference (OK Green), but it will have some new faces and Football has a different alignment than other sports. Football will join Reeths-Puffer, Muskegon, Byron Center, Grand Rapids Union, and Forest Hills Northern. All of our other sports are paired with Reeths-Puffer, Muskegon, Byron Center, Caledonia, and Jenison. As we look forward to building new relationships and rivalries, we need to know where we have been.

This past year saw many individual and team accomplishments. Mona Shores High School had 26 Academic All-State Members with 1 Academic All-American in Eva Stout in Swim. This was matched with 4 Academic All State Teams (Boys Tennis, Volleyball, Competitive Cheer, and Girls Tennis) and 1 Academic All-American Team in Girls Swim. Mona Shores Athletics continues to set a high bar within the classroom. We also had success on the playing surface with 89 All Ok Conference athletes on 5 Conference Championship Teams. Girls Golf, Volleyball, Competitive Cheer, Girls Soccer, and Boys Golf all took the OK Green by storm on our way to joining a new look OK Green. We had close calls for District Championships in Volleyball, Football, Boys Basketball, Girls Basketball, Competitive Cheer, Girls Soccer, and Baseball with all of these teams losing in the District Finals. Girls Lacrosse, Boys Tennis, Girls Tennis, and both Girls and Boys Golf gave us close opportunities for Regional Championships as well. Our programs are on the edge of greatness and athletes as well as coaches are pushing for the quest of holding a Mitten! (state tournament awards) The GMAA has become something that many past and future Sailors have come to covet as well. MSHS compiled 8 Greater Muskegon Athletic Association Championships during the 2023-2024 school vear.

The individual honors were just as impressive as the team awards listed above. MSHS boasted 8 All-District Athletes in Niesha Sharp(Competitive Cheer), Zack Keessen and Trevor Cunningham (Baseball), and Shay Norden, Jersey VanderWall, Ava Freye, and Ella Kinney(Girls Soccer). All-Region honors were bestowed upon Luke Emmons, Andrew Baker, Jeremiah Love, and O'Mari Hall-Brown in football as well as Shay Norden in Girls Soccer. The most impressive of all feats this year is our All-State athletes. In Boys Tennis we had Drew Hackney and Victor Powell

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earn All-State. Girls Lacrosse had a 3rd team member in Jordyn Briseno and Girls Soccer had Shay Norden earn 1st Team Honors. Sailor Nation was also represented at the state level with Peyton Petersen from Wrestling earning his way to the State Championships as well as Derek Kern throwing a 300 game in his Regional Qualifier to take him the States. In the Spring both Jayda Trigg and Ryan Opsommer went to the State Finals in shot put and hurdles respectively. Another set of great accomplishments on their respective surfaces.



With all of these individuals, two really stand out. Shay Norden became the 2nd ever 1st Team All-State Soccer athlete in the history of Mona Shores. She joins Reagan Cox in this accomplishment. Shay helped our Girls program claim their 8th Conference Championship in the row and also earned a ranking of #10 in Division 1 rankings. On

her way to becoming All-State, Shay accumulated over 100 career goals which earned her the title of Division 1 Offensive Player of the Year by the Michigan High School Soccer Coaches Association. A remarkable career by a remarkable woman. Shay will continue her playing career at Calvin University.

The other student athlete to rise above is Drew Hackney.



Drew wrapped up his career by becoming a 4 time 1st team All-State player in Boys Tennis. Drew's career was marked by many wins in becoming the schools all time wins

leader with an impressive home undefeated record. Drew was also honored by his coaches association by being a Mr. Tennis Finalist in Division 2. Drew will also continue playing at Trine University.

With all of the success listed above one might think we are bragging. However we are doing just that. These student-athletes have earned that right. They need to be celebrated and also recognized for what they have done for Sailor Nation. This is not something we need to apologize for, but something we will continue to make notice of and push for more student-athletes to follow these standards. Sailor Nation be proud of your young men and women as they continue to represent Mona Shores with great pride and gratitude for all you have done for them.

A Look Ahead at Fall Sports

If you have students entering the High School or the Middle School, they are entering the realm of school sports. Interscholastic sports come with accountability, expectations, and PRIDE. They are different from youth sports in that there may be cuts made to keep the correct number of athletes on a team or there are more responsibilities and dates for practices. There are specific requirements for a student to play school sponsored sports.



FINAL F**URMS**

Students and parents must create a Final Forms account in order for your son or daughter to sign up for Middle School and High School Athletics at Mona Shores. It is a free service for the athletes and parents but does need to occur as a part of the requirement of playing school sports. Final Forms allows the Athletic Department to collect all the needed forms and information that was once filled out on paper. You will also upload your physicals onto Final Forms. You can start or edit your Final Forms account by going to the QR Code.

MHSAA Physical

A doctor must fill out a MHSAA Physical form stating that your student is healthy enough to participate in athletics. This needs to be done each year. In order for your student to have an up to date physical, it must have been completed after April 15, 2024 to be used for the 2024-2025 school year. Mona Shores offers 3 opportunities each summer for these to be done right here at the High School campus each year. You can also see your primary provider or an Urgent Care. These must be done prior to practicing or trying out for a school team.

Eligibility

In order for a student to play a sport at MSMS or at MSHS they must be a student first. The term Student-Athlete is in a very particular order in that an athlete must be a student first. If a student falls below eligibility standards they will need to sit for a period of time in order to get back onto the playing field. This also goes for discipline as well. The student handbook for both buildings outlines what those standards are.

These 3 main differences between Youth or Club Sports and School Sponsored sports are sometimes misunderstood or unknown. The Mona Shores Public Schools Athletic Department and Administrative Team feel that it is important that new athletes, new students, and parents at home know what is expected of them. Celebrating Sailors Academic Achievements in Spring

2024: Congratulations to the students who participated in the advanced placement courses. There were 482 exams taken by 296 students. MSHS offered 22 AP Exams. There were a total of 240 students who earned a 3 or higher allowing for college credit to be earned. The percent of total AP students with scores of 3 or higher is 82.%. Well above the state and global average. This is a tremendous achievement. A direct reflection of the commitment of our students' tremendous work ethics and commitment to a rigorous curriculum that will best prepare students for post secondary education. In addition, the Class of 2024 had 3 seniors earn the AP Capstone Diploma, signifying completion of 6 or more AP courses including AP Research and AP Seminar. Our teachers who lead these programs continue to participate as AP readers and attend specialized professional development. Their commitment is to be commended.

Celebrating the Class of 2024!

The Class of 2024 earned 7 million dollars in academic and athletic scholarships. In addition, there were 113 students who earned academic honor cords, 33 seniors earned a 3.5 or higher, 30 seniors earned a 3.75 or higher and 50 seniors earned a 4.0 or higher. The National Honors Society senior members totaled over 3, 964 community service and tutoring hours earning the Michigan Community Impact Award and the National Community Service Sapphire Award. The list of fine art awards earned is extensive as well. Most notably the MSPS Fine Arts department earned national distinction for being named Best Communities for Music Education in 2024 for the 9th year in a row. And MSHS being named a "Best High Schools in America" for the 6th year in a row.



FAFSA NIGHT:

We will invite an area representative to come in and present any updates and changes to the Free Application for Federal Student Aid to our families. This is very informative and aimed at getting families set to apply by the October 1 opening. We are planning for the 4th week of September. More information to follow.

COLLEGE VISITS:

Many colleges send representatives to our high school in the fall to talk to interested students. These visits usually begin in late September and continue through November. We will post notices of these visits on the daily announcements and Counseling Office bulletin board. We also have a link that will be updated weekly: https://www.monashores.net/o/mshs/page/college-and-career-preparation-resources

JUNIORS AND SENIORS interested in talking to a particular college representative must sign up in the Counseling Office during the week of that school's visit. They must also obtain permission from the classroom teacher for that hour to attend.

Seniors may take up to 2 college visitation days to visit the colleges of their choice during the school year (to be charged as "XT" exempt from absences total - college visitation) pending prior counselor and administration approval. The form is available in the Attendance Office, and the student is responsible for getting the following signatures prior to the day off: parent, counselor, and administrator. The student must have a college representative sign the form at the college while visiting and then return it to the Attendance Office. If the form is not completed prior to the visit, the absence may be excused by the parent, BUT will not be exempt. The visitation days may not be used to visit MCC or Baker during school hours as they are local and students will have availability to attend during non school days.

COLLEGE APPLICATIONS

Most colleges, including Muskegon Community College, would prefer that students apply online at the college website beginning August 1. After students have completed their college application, place an order for your high school transcript in Parchment to be sent to the college where you applied (undergraduate admissions). The 'Order Records' link is found on the Mona Shores High School webpage. Please allow 5 school days for processing. All electronic requests for transcripts are free of charge through July 31 of the student's graduation year. Students must request OFFICIAL ACT/SAT scores directly from ACT or SAT. (There is a fee assessed for this service.) This can be done at www.actstudent.org or https://collegereadiness. collegeboard.org/ if the student did not indicate at the time of registration for ACT/SAT to mail scores to prospective colleges.

FINANCIAL AID

SELECTIVE SERVICE

It is important that young men register with the selective service when they turn 18. It is the law, and it may adversely affect eligibility for federal financial aid. Eligible candidates can now register online by going to this website: http://www.sss.gov. You need your social security number to complete this process.

Welcome to the 2024-25 School Year! We are excited to see your students first thing on Thursday morning, August 29th!



Our team of special educators will be in classrooms all over the district that morning greeting students, being an extra set of hands for teachers, and helping out where they are most needed.



The Danger of Heatstroke



- Over the past two years, more than 100 children have died from being unattended in a hot car.
- Never leave a child alone in a car, not even for a minute.
- A car can heat up 19 degrees in 10 minutes. Cracking a window does not help.
- A young child's body heats up 3-5 times faster than an adult's.
