


NM Transportation is On the Move!

Adapt, make the best of what we have and roll with the changes.


Local Penpals in Third Grade

During the last six weeks of the school year, our Spring Term provides high school students the opportunity to include a number of elective courses. One such course offered this year, Bioethics and Dissections, engaged students in exploration of ethical topics like animal experimentation and organ transplantation. Students heard from Gift of Life Michigan's Alison Gillum. She brought in plasticized human organs for them to see and hold as well as introduced students to the many ways that human organs and tissues can both save lives and improve quality of life.

NM Students Explore Biology From the Inside Out!

The highlight of the course, though, was the dissection experience. Students dissected four different organisms including the following: perch, starfish, dogfish sharks, and fetal pigs. One student, Freshman Elliott Irving, said the class "taught me more than I thought it would and it was really fun...it made me reflect on what I need and noticed that we are like many animals."



For three of their dissection experiences, high school students worked with small groups of third or fourth grade students who had a chance to both observe and participate. Each third and fourth grade group spent a class period with high school students dissecting



and learning about a different organism. Junior Matt Lertra said it "...was different from anything I'd done before, and I had to figure out how to explain things in a way that young students could understand."

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




Norse POPS 2024!
